Floral Park Ophthalmology Cataract Surgery Pre-Operative & Post-Operative Instructions

Day-Op Ambulatory Surgery Center of Long Island, 110 Willis Avenue, Mineola, NY 11501

- 1. The day before surgery (Tuesday), please call the Day-Op Ambulatory Surgery Center of Long Island at 516-294-0030 between 1-3 pm to get the time of your surgery.
- 2. The day of surgery bring all four eye medications to the surgery center.
- 3. Do not wear makeup the day of your surgery! Leave valuables at home.
- 4. If you take any glaucoma eye drops, take them as usual; any vital oral medications, take as normal with a very small sip of water.
- 5. Do NOT eat or drink after midnight the day before surgery.
- 6. You MUST have a driver to take you home from surgery.

PRE-OPERATIVE INSTRUCTIONS

Pre-surgical Testing:

- 1. Pre-surgical tests (blood, EKG) are done at the Day-Op Ambulatory Surgery Center of Long Island in Mineola about one week prior to surgery.
- 2. <u>After</u> pre-surgical tests have been done, you **MAY BE ASKED** go to your Primary Care Physician for medical clearance depending on your medical history. If clearance is not obtained when needed, surgery will be cancelled.

Medication:

- 1. If you are on a daily aspirin regimen or take any blood thinners, i.e Plavix, Coumadin, you MUST STOP before surgery. Ask your doctor how long you can discontinue them. 2 weeks pre-op is preferred. TAKE ONLY TYLENOL FOR PAIN.
- 2. Do not take multi-vitamins 2 weeks pre-op.
- 3. THREE DAYS PRIOR TO SURGERY on Sunday, Monday & Tuesday, take Prolensa & Besivance 1 drop once a day 5 minutes apart in the surgery eye only. Please reference the simple Medication Chart below.
- 4. <u>Before leaving your home for Day-Op on Wednesday, the day of surgery</u>, take 1 drop each of dilating drops, Tropicamide & Phenylephrine 5 minutes apart (they have **RED caps** & blur your vision). Wait 15 minutes and then take one more drop each of Tropicamide & Phenylephrine 5 minutes apart. Please reference the simple Medication Chart below.
- 5. Bring all four eye medications to the surgery center.
- 6. If you take any glaucoma eyedrops, take them as usual; any vital oral medications, take as normal with a very small sip of water.
- 7. Do NOT eat or drink after midnight the day before surgery.

POST-OPERATIVE INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Wear eye shield the first week to bed at night to protect the eye.
- 2. Take eye drops Prolensa 1X/day & Besivance 2X/day following surgery beginning when you get home from surgery. Do not stop taking them until your next follow-up and new instructions are given by the doctor.
- 3. Wear your own eyeglasses inside and the dark wraparound cataract sunglasses outside for one week to protect the eye from dust and dirt.

RESTRICTIONS

- 1. Do not get the eye wet, touch, press nor rub the eye.
- 2. No deep bending below the waist. Kneel to pick up light objects.
- 3. No driving for one week or until you get clearance from Dr. Jindra and /or Dr.Luck
- 4. No heavy lifting for one week.
- 5. Do not get soap or water in surgery eye when showering as you are likely to rub it. Wear cataract glasses in shower to protect the eye from water.
- 6. If there is pain, a decrease in vision, an increase in mucus, bleeding or discharge from the eye, <u>call the office immediately 516-616-1710</u>. This may be the early signs of an infection which should be treated right away.
- 7. It is not unusual to have blurry vision post-op and some patients will need to wait at least one month to change their current glasses.
- 8. Some patients will notice spots (floaters), this is not unusual. If you notice white lights (flashes), call the office.
